I have just returned from Chile, and wished to share with you the impressions I have of the change following the plebiscite -- a change to which you contributed greatly.

As you recall, our relationship goes back fifteen years to the time immediately following the military take-over of the Chileen government and the assasination of Salvador Allende. You were a great help to me and my family, and helped us bridge some very sad and difficult times.

Many persons who voted in the election earlier this month are too young to remember their country as one with a democratic history. Those who voted October 5 in their first election were only three years old when democracy coased to exist.

Your efforts in supporting a return to the democratic process in Chile are known to so many of us who longed for a return to freedom. I speak not only for myself and for my family in thanking you for what you have done, but for the Chilean people themselves.
