The Commission on Human Rights.

- Aware of its responsibility to promote and encourage respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms and resolved to remain vigilant with regard to violations of human rights wherever they occur,
- Noting the obligation of the Government of Chile to respect and protect human rights in accordance with the International Instruments to which Chile is a party, as obligation which is not different from that of any other government which is a party to international human rights instruments,
- Mecalling the successive recolutions on the situation of homes rights in Ohile and in particular its Besolution 11 COXOT of 6 Narch 1979, by which it appointed a Special Reporteur on the situation of these rights, and its Resolution 1985/A7 of 19 Narch 1995, in which agreed most recently to extend the mundate of the Special Reporteur for one more year,
- Necalling alms, using other resolutions, describ Assembly Resolution MoVMs of 15 December 1955 in which the Assembly Invited the Commission on Hearn Rights to take the most appropriate stepper for the effective restoration of hearn rights and fundamental Freedoms in that country, including the extension of the module of the Special Apperture for one mer year,

Having examined the Special Rapporteur's repo

- 1. Commends the Special Rapporteur for his Report on the Situation of Human Rights in Chile, prepared in accordance with Resolution 1985/47;
 - 2. Recogniss as a positive development the fact that the Government of Chile provided to the Special Rapporteur the cooperation and freedom of access to persons of all social, political and economic interests necessary for his investigations;

- 3. Although sours of the radicalising consequence of many years without adopted domands for descentic popular porticipation in public affairs, the Commission cannot fail to entire that Chie is suffering from a high number of terrorist incidents which result in widespread integrations violence, and believes that not incidents on and should'se by terrorist through resource consistent with respect for the rule of law and with the Government's continuous time property of the rule of law and with the Government's collisions to expect home rights.
- 4. Expresses its conviction that a legal and political structure based upon a civilized dialogue, conductive to a democratically elected government representative of the will of the people, is essential to the full observance of homes within to 2014.
