Our **Summer Public Service Program** guarantees rising 2L and 3L students a stipend up to \$8,000 for up to 10 weeks of full-time, supervised work with a nonprofit, government, or legislative office.



Our **Loan Repayment Assistance Program** covers full loan payments for graduates employed in qualified public interest careers earning up to **\$75,000, and a portion up to \$120,000 per year.**

The practice of law is a service at its heart. This mindset animates our curriculum, our buildings, and our ethos. Our public service programming is the most comprehensive in the nation. We equip entire cohorts to go out into the world and make a difference.

Stand on the shoulders of a civil rights giant.

The William Wayne Justice Center for Public Interest

Judge William Wayne Justice was famous for his forward-looking, compassionate rulings during a 40-year career on the bench, starting in the 1960s. Today, the Center that bears his name fosters a more just and equitable world.

As the hub of public interest work at Texas Law, the Center offers:

- **Specialized public interest education and resources** for students, attorneys, faculty, staff, and the community.
- **Pro bono opportunities** that promote a culture of service through the Richard and Ginni Mithoff Pro Bono Program.
- **An engaged community** of students and alumni engaged in public service and public interest work.

Find your community of changemakers.

The Justice Center is our hub for public service. But it's not the only place where you'll learn to give back.

Bech-Loughlin First Amendment Center: Explores and advances First Amendment protections through conferences, lectures, debates, and clinics.

Rapoport Center for Human Rights and Justice: Serves as a focal point for critical, interdisciplinary analysis and practice of human rights, here and across the globe.

The Budd Innocence Center: Highlights issues related to wrongful convictions and educates students through the Actual Innocence Clinic.

The Capital Punishment Center: Gathers scholars, students, and practitioners focused on the death penalty and offers the Capital Punishment Clinic.

Student Organizations: Here, students take charge in the **Public Interest Law Association**, and **Texas Law Fellowships**, to name just two.

Where Public Service Pays

Pursuing a career in public service is about impact—and we're here to support you along the way.

Supporting students and graduates who do the work.

Texas Law offers distinct scholarships, fellowships, and work opportunities for public interest and public service.

- **Full-tuition public interest scholarships awarded annually.** You read that correctly. We cover 100% of tuition for highly competitive students every year through a scholarship program just for those pursuing public interest.
- **Up to \$8,000 with our Summer Public Service Program.** Available and guaranteed to all students, we've invested more than \$4M for over 500 students participating since 2023.
- **\$75K/year postgraduate public service fellowships.** This flexible fellowship program allows you to collaborate with an organization of your choice to create a position.
- **Loan Repayment Assistance Program, up to a salary ceiling of \$120K.** If you land a qualifying public service job (including a fellowship), we'll repay 100% of your loans up to a salary ceiling of \$75K. Then, it's a sliding scale up to a salary of \$120K/year.

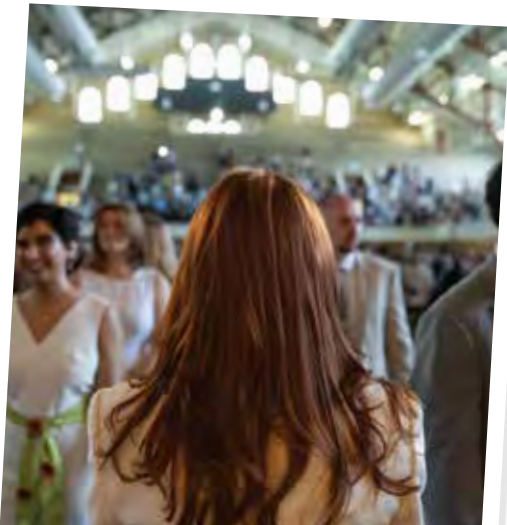

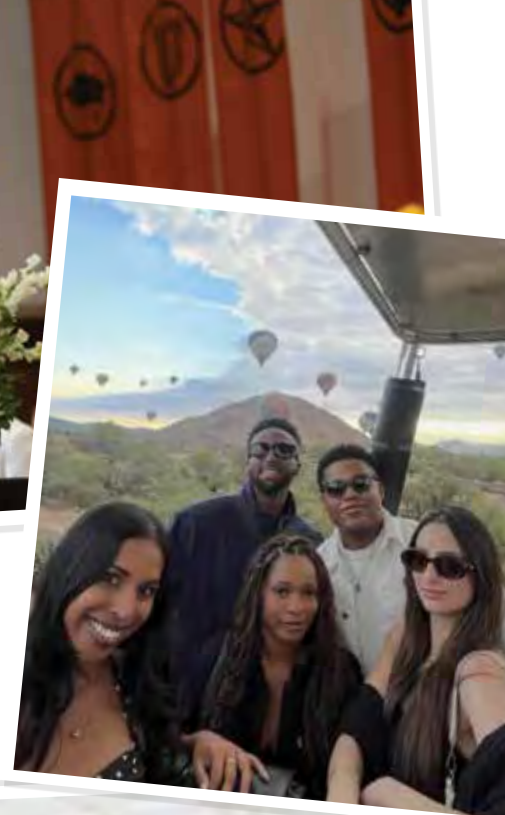
