

Petition to Enroll in Non-Law Graduate Course for Credit Toward LL.M. Degree

LL.M. students may apply a small number of credit hours of non-law courses taken at the University of Texas towards the 24 credit hours required for a LL.M. degree. Courses taken for credit towards the LL.M. degree must be related to a course of study offered in the School of Law and must be graduate level courses. Law students taking graduate level courses will be permitted to apply the actual credits earned towards their LL.M. degree. Even though the grade will transfer only as Credit/No credit, students must earn a C or better, and the graduate level course cannot be taken on a Pass/Fail basis.
