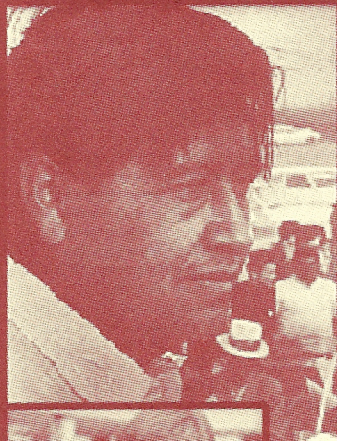

On the way to graduating from Berkeley, and then Boalt School of Law, Michael Tigar worked as a printer's apprentice, daycamp teacher, restaurant employee, and journalist for Pacifica Radio.

For the last thirty years, Michael has been a vigorous and respected advocate of civil rights and liberty. He has authored six books, one hundred law review articles, and three plays.

Known for his mesmerizing courtroom presence and peerless trial preparation, Michael Tigar has represented many different, diverse, and notable, people: the Chicago Eight, H. Rap Brown, Angela Davis, Kay Bailey Hutchinson, Terry Nichols, Chicano Peace Movement leader Rosalio Muñoz, Kiko Martínez, and Fernando Chávez, son of César Chávez.

In other corners of the globe, Michael worked with the African National Congress struggle against apartheid struggle and helped write South Africa's new constitution. He has fought tirelessly to bring to justice the former Chilean military junta and its sponsors.

Michael Tigar is also a law professor at Washington College of Law, American University, where he teaches human rights law and works with his students on international human rights cases, including a suit on behalf of the Chagossian people, and a suit against Henry Kissinger for the assassination by the Pinochet regime of political exile General René Schneider.

Michael Tigar has three children, Jon, Kate and Elizabeth. He is married to Jane Tigar, with whom he also practices law.
