Life goes on. Baby girl Harmon (Victoria Lynn) is now seven weeks old and well over 12 pounds. She is alert and no trouble whatsoever—she has slept through the night since her first week at home. Nonetheless, there is room for condolences: Everyone says she looks like me!

Los Angeles is not nearly as bad as we all remembered it last year. There are places and people to avoid, but there are also places and people to enjoy. We are even considering the purchase of a home. Right now we are looking in the Santa Monica Canyon and Palisades area. The tight money situation has brought within our reach several homes that a year ago would have been "untouchable".
