Bheki Mlangeni Memorial Lectures: In 1988 and 1989, I was in South Africa to work with the Black Lawyers Association and the African National Congress, teaching trial advocacy skills to Black lawyers. I returned in 1991 to give lectures at the University of the Western Cape. I have lightly edited them, and have included some of the questions and answers from the question period. These lectures were given from notes, and I have not corrected every infelicity of expression. There are three lectures. The first was entitled Three Myths. The second was The Advocate and Social Change. The third was Old Judges and New Laws. This final lecture was one of the things that convinced the ANC to put a constitutional court into the South African constitution, and I was gratified to see this happen.
