- A copy of your current resume.
- A copy of the CSO Study Break Public Service Stipend Program Recipient Agreement.
- A letter from your sponsoring organization stating that the organization has an internship for you, along with the name of your supervising attorney, the type of legal work you will be performing as a summer intern, and that they are unable to pay you.

STUDENTS ELIGIBLE FOR THE STIPEND

The 2019 CSO Study Break Public Service Stipend is open to current 1Ls and 2Ls (Classes of 2021 and 2020). A student may not receive academic credit and a stipend simultaneously, nor can a student receive a fellowship from an alternate source and this program for the same position. (This limitation does not preclude a fellow from receiving a living expense stipend or a stipend of scholarship for educational expenses.)

SELECTION PROCESS

A review committee appointed by the Assistant Dean for Career Services will evaluate the applications and select recipients based on the following criteria, which you should consider when completing your application.

- nature of the work and relevance to the applicant's long-term career goals;
- student record of participation and involvement at Texas Law; and
- overall quality of application.

We anticipate awarding an equal number of stipends to first- and second-year students, if possible.
